Dear Parents/Guardians,

Welcome to the start of the new school year! Please take time to read through the information in this monthly letter to help you better support your child's/ward's education.

FOR YOUR ACTION

1) **Parent Communication App**

Starting from this year, the school will be using the application “Class Dojo” as the communication platform between the school and parents/guardians to strengthen home-school collaboration. An **invitation link to download and join Class Dojo** has been sent to all parents/guardians via your **child's/ward "Google eLearn email accounts"** set-up by the school. We have created a simple **instructional video to guide you with the Class Dojo login**. There will also be an **onboarding exercise** in the upcoming **Parent-Teacher Conference 1 on Friday, 2 February** to support parents/guardians in the use of the communication platform.

The school will disseminate important information to parents/caregivers via Class Dojo, as well as provide updates of your child's/ward's learning in school. Parents/Guardians will also be able to **contact your child's/ward's teachers** during office hours (8.30 a.m. to 5.30 p.m.) via the **individual messaging function**. Do note that the teachers will not be able to respond to you promptly during their teaching periods.

During PTC 1, the school will be sharing **updates on our curriculum and programmes**, as well as various ways to strengthen home-school collaboration. Class teachers will be going through the **students' Education Goals (EG)** document and sharing the **key learning focuses of 2024**, to empower parents to support their child/ward's learning in school.

Students will also undertake **home-based learning (HBL)** on 2 February. Please scan the **QR code to indicate your attendance** for PTC 1 by **Monday, 8 January**. Parents'/Guardians' attendance for PTC 1 is strongly encouraged and we look forward to a meaningful time of meeting with you.



3) **2024 Home-Based Learning (HBL) and No School for Students Days**

We have enclosed the **schedule for 2024 HBL dates, as well as other dates when there will be no school**. Please make provision to support your child's/ward's learning and well-being during HBL days. More information will be provided by your child's/ward's class teacher nearing the HBL dates.

4) **2024 New Academic Year Home Visit**

The school will be resuming our annual new academic home visit exercise with the aim of strengthening home-school collaboration by gaining a holistic understanding of the student, including his/her home environment. We have designated **Tuesday, 27 February as a HBL day** to facilitate these home visits and class teachers will be scheduling a date that would work best with you during Term 1 for these visits.

5) **Sale of Uniform in School**

The school uniform supplier (Jeep Sing Fashion) will be selling the school uniform in front of school bookshop:

The school will not issue the uniforms to your child, including students on the Financial Assistance Scheme. • As part of school safety and security, caregivers entering the school will need to register with the security officer at the school main entrance.

6) **Option to Wear Long Track Pants for PE Lessons**

The school is introducing the **option** for students to wear **long track pants during Physical Education (PE) lessons** to improve comfort and engagement in physical activities. Pants should be **loose fitting, plain (with no designs), and in black or navy/dark blue colours**. Students must also follow the current **PE attire guidelines** as stated in the Student Diary. These pants will **NOT** be available for purchase from our uniform vendor.

7) Safe Management Measures

We seek parents'/guardians' support to keep schools a safe environment for students. If your child/ward is **unwell**, please ensure that he/she stays at home and seeks **medical attention** if necessary. If your child is recovering from respiratory-related illnesses, please encourage him/her to exercise social responsibility (e.g., by wearing a mask, minimising social interactions with big groups). We appreciate your support and will continue to work with you closely. Let us all do our part to exercise personal and social responsibility and stay safe.

8) Attendance and Punctuality Policies

Students are expected to **attend school every school day** to ensure they benefit the most from the curriculum. If a student is unable to attend school or any school-related event, a **medical certificate** is required to be submitted on the next school day. Please note that your child's/ward's ART positive result will **NOT** be accepted as a valid reason for student absenteeism.

Students are also expected to arrive **punctually** every school day, i.e. **7.30 a.m. for the AM session**. Please refer to the Student Diary on the attendance and punctuality policy for students.

9) Wednesday, 10 January – Temperature-Taking Exercise

The school will be conducting a temperature-taking exercise on **Wednesday, 10 January**. All students **MUST** bring their digital thermometer to school on that day. Students may purchase the digital thermometer at \$3.40 and/or a battery at \$0.20 at the School Bookshop. The school also requires students to bring the following items for the upkeep of their personal hygiene:

- 1 tissue/wet-tissue pack to wipe their own thermometers after use and for general use
- 1 labelled ziplock bag or container to keep the thermometer if there is no casing
- 1 labelled ziplock bag or container to keep their mask (if any).

10) 2024 Book List

We have enclosed the 2024 Book List. The class teacher has indicated on the list the **required learning materials to be purchased** for your child/ward. Please pay the **exact amount** for the materials to your child/ward's class teacher by **Friday, 12 January**.

11) School Fees Schedule 2024

The schedule of **school fees payment for 2024** is as follows:

You are strongly encouraged to pay your child's/ward's school fees via **GIRO**. For parents/guardians who have not opted for GIRO deduction or whose applications are unsuccessful, please pay the fees to the General Office via cash or cheque (made payable to Grace Orchard School A/C 2).

For school fees paid through Edusave, a portion of the fees, amounting to \$6.50, will be paid through GIRO/PSEA or by cash. In the event where a student withdraws from school before the month is up, school fees for the month must still be paid in full. Please refer to the Student Diary on the school fees structure.

12) **Personal Digital Learning Programme (PDLP) – For 13 to 18 year-old students only**

The Ministry of Education (MOE) has launched the National Digital Literacy Programme (NDLP) for all schools and Institutes of Higher Learning to help students strengthen their digital literacy. One of the components of the NDLP is the introduction of the Personalised Digital Learning Programme (PDLP) for all secondary school students. At GOS, **every secondary/high school student aged 13 years old and above will own a school-prescribed Personal Learning Device (PLD)**. The PLD will be used in tandem with relevant educational technology to personalise and enhance students’ learning. This will enable students to acquire digital skills and apply these skills as they navigate an increasingly digitalised world.

For students aged 13 years old, and have yet to purchase the PLD in 2023, more information about the purchase of the PLD, as well as the accompanying applications that the school may be rolling out will be provided to parents/guardians in due course.

13) **Issuance of Developmental Disability Registry (DDR) Identity Card – For new students only**

All **new students who joined the school in Term 1** will be receiving his/her Developmental Disability Registry (DDR) Identity Card from the school. The DDR identity card bears the contact information of the student’ caregivers, and social service agency they are receiving services at, for the public to help the student return to safety if needed. Parents/Guardians will need to **acknowledge the receipt of the cards** once you have received them from the class teacher.

14) **Issuance of School Smart Card (SSC) – For 13-year-old students only**

The SSC serves as the student’s identification card and can be used for concessionary travel on public transport and to borrow library books from the National Library Board and the school’s library, amongst other usage.

Current Students	The school has processed the making of the SSC with Transit Link and will be issuing the SSC to the students through the class teachers. Parents/guardians will need to acknowledge the receipt of the cards once you have received them from your child’s/ward’s class teacher.
New Students	The school will process the making of the SSC with Transit Link upon receipt of the students’ passport photo. Parents/guardians will need to prepare a passport photo for your child/ward. The passport photo should be taken in school uniform with a white background . Please pass the passport photo to your child’s/ward’s class teacher.

15) **Vocational Education (Voc Ed) Programme**

The Voc Ed programme is a critical aspect of preparing your child for his/her future and is part of the school’s curriculum for our students aged **13 to 18 years old**. This table summarises the Voc Ed lessons that will be held on different days for the respective classes.

IMPORTANT SCHOOL INFORMATION

20) Student Group Personal Accident Insurance Policy

All students of Grace Orchard School are covered under the **Student Group Personal Accident Insurance Policy**. The insurance can help parents cover some medical expenses that may be incurred if their children are injured while participating in school activities. The medical expenses claim form is available from the General Office. The claim form with the original medical receipts must be submitted to School within 14 days from the date of the accident.

Listed below are the revised benefits and terms in the Student Group Personal Accident Insurance Policy currently in force:

Name of Insurer	Chubb Insurance Singapore Limited
Medical expenses limit	\$7,500 per student (Note: Medical expenses limit for registered Chinese physician – \$150 per student)
Accident death & permanent disablement benefits	\$25,000 per student
20% co-payment requirement for parents on each medical expenses claim submitted (i.e. the insurer will reimburse only up to 80% of all approved medical expenses incurred.)

22) School Safety and Security

The security of the school is crucial in providing a safe environment for the education of our students. We seek your understanding and cooperation in complying with the Road Safety and Visitor Management Policies.

A. No Parking in The School Carpark

- i. Only the school staff and visitors with scheduled appointments can park in the school car park.
- ii. Visitors are to park in the yellow lots. However, should the yellow lots be full, visitors will park their cars at the public car park at the nearby HDB car parks.
- iii. Drive-in is allowed during the school arrival and dismissal time for parents to send and fetch their children.

- iv. All visitors must heed the directions of the security officers when parking on the school premises.
- v. The engine of all parked vehicles must be turned off according to the Environmental Protection and Management (vehicular-emissions) Regulations. Failure to comply may lead to a report to the NEA for further actions.

B. Visitor Registration at the Security Post

- i. All visitors with scheduled appointments to meet staff must register at the Security Post upon entering the school. Visitors will be given visitor's pass.
- ii. Please proceed to the General Office Counter to inform office staff concerning the appointment.
- iii. Visitors are not allowed to walk around the school premises unaccompanied by school staff.
